He is also a senior advisor to Frasers Property Ltd and the Canadian Pension Plan Investment Board. He was previously the Chairman of Global Logistic Properties Ltd, Chairman of ULI Asia Pacific, President of GIC Real Estate Pte Ltd and board director of GIC Private Limited. Before joining GIC, he was a Senior Partner at Jones Lang Wootton in Sydney.
